### LIFE EVENT



We have just celebrated Holy Week and it is a good time to review what it is. which calls upon and mobilizes the entire Church to perform such diverse and unique signs and commemorations during this time. We will do so guided by the First Letter that the Apostle Saint Paul wrote to the Christians of Corinth.

Before telling us about the things Jesus did and the words he said, what (constitutes the center of the Gospels) the first community transmitted to us the an event they witnessed that changed their lives forever: -That he who was crucified on Friday, died, remained in the tomb on Saturday, rose again on the third day, the Lord, from God.

-That this event, which we know as the "Paschal Mystery", gave an answer to the anguish which causes in all human beings - that we not only want to live, but to live forever - the certainty of death, the hope that the prophets of the People of Israel proclaimed from the Old Testament (hence the insistence of Saint Paul, the insistence of Saint Paul, in accordance with the Scriptures).

-That irruption of the immeasurable love and eternity of God into the time of humanity, would mark a before and after, both in the lives of those who were its first witnesses, as well as in the whole of history, and that is why the need to spread this message throughout all time and place, thus giving rise to the mission of the Church.


